Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Sidney Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874, and June 14, 1878, "to encourage the growth of timber on the Western Prairies," the claim of John Cloud

has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South West quarter of Section two in Township fifteen North of Range fifty two West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John Cloud

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John Cloud and to his heirs and assigns forever. and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In testimony whereof J. Theodore Roosevelt PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
