At Chelton in said County on this 21st day of August
A. D. 1832, personally appeared in open Court, before H. Titus, Hutchinson Damsel Colby
& Thomas Jones Justices of the County of

the Court of said Orange County, now sitting, being a Court of Record Forest Cloud a resident of Tunbridge in the County of Orange
and State of Vermont, aged 67 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit
of the act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832, that he certifies the services of the latter States, under the following
name of officer and soldier as James Stated. that he was born in Braintree Massachusetts and lived
there through the war of the Revolution. that in September 1781, from duty after Dr. Daniel
was brought by the Doctor Arnold. he volunteered in the Militia of Cambridge or Boston, for the
term of one month in the Campury Commanded by Capt. & Surgeon Hewitt. in Col. Huntington
Regiment. to go to Spaten Fort in N. State and much part of an enlistment to P. Fort and was then
stationed during 3 months which expired some time in October & was employed drawing cannon
back from the water to the fort & repairing the fort & an gun. that while he was so employ
at part of the one or two before the expiration of his month's service he again enlisted in
the service after as he thinks in the State service or State troops of Vermont for the term of
eight months in the Campury Commanded by Capt. Hewitt in the Regiment command
ed by Col. Huntington and was stationed at P. Fort during the whole of the
term - he thinks there was only his Regiment stationed at the Fort at that time that
he was sent about one or two miles as a picket guard with others, down the River -
about three miles - that they were employed as above mentioned in repairing the Fort
& Barracks & supplying the Cannon - & on duty & an gun. & patrole duty till some time
in the month of June 1782 he cannot recollect the day. but was nine months from the
time of his first enlistment - he was then and there discharged by Col. Huntington,
as he believes, and verbally - that since the Revolution he has resided in Braintree. & has
now and Tunbridge in Vermont at which last place he now resides that he has no
documentary evidence of his service, & that he knows of no person whose testimony
he can procure who can testify to his service except the depositions of John Pike & Fran
ces Cloud - that he certifies to his name Forest Cloud -

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever, to a pension or annuity, except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the agency of any State. to his knowledge

Windsor County } On this 12th day of October A.D. 1858. Personally ap-
peared before the Probate Court of the District of Rutland ~~Winn~~
Clara a widow of Ironsides in the county of Windsor & State of
Vermont aged 72 years, who being first duly sworn according to
law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to
obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress
passed July 7th 1838 entitled "An act granting half pay & pensions
to certain widows" that she is the widow of Forrest Cloud who
was a Private in the War of the Revolution. She cannot tell the office
under whom he served, but is confident that he was in service at
New-London Conn. in 1781 when that place was destroyed by Gen
Arnold, and she has no documentary proof of his service.

She further says that her husband was a Pensioner at the time
of his decease, that he received a Pension Certificate under the act of
Congress of June 7th 1832 which was dated the day of ¹⁸³⁰ 1830 by
which he was entitled to receive thirty dollars per annum, that she
was married to the said Forrest Cloud on the day of March seven-
teen hundred & eighty six, & that her husband the aforesaid Forrest
Cloud died on the 27th day of December 1834. That she was not mar-
ried to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took
place previous to the first of January seven-teen hundred & ninety
four A.D. at the time above stated.

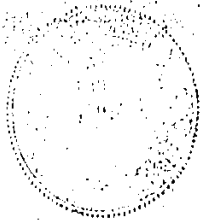
